Mrs Gow's words for the week



We've had a very outdoor focused week with the Anderton Centre, orienteering in Owl class, Forest Friday for EYFS and netball matches. There have been definite signs of spring's arrival this week, with some lovely sunshine. It was an absolute delight to spend quality time with Fox class, Mrs Riddell, Mrs Burton and Mrs Lorgat at the Anderton Centre. It is fabulous to see the children grow so much in confidence as they face outdoor challenges, push themselves outside of their comfort zones and, for some children, stay away from home for the very first time! The centre has the most amazing outdoor leaders who really have a sense of fun. A huge thank you to the staff who gave of their own time to help the children make memories.

We have had a few parents mention that their children have been sniffly or have a temperature after playing out or after Forest school sessions. I spoke to one of our resident parent GPs this morning and they absolutely reassured me that being outside (in all weathers) is good for you (in fact, it is healthier than being indoors). Colds, fevers etc are caused by viruses and bacterias, not being outdoors. She stated that the key to staying healthy in all weathers is layering and proper clothing, as if you stay warm then your immune system will stay in peak form! As a school we are deeply committed to being outdoors in our learning as much as possible, so do please make sure that your child has warm clothes, a waterproof coat, spare clothing and wellies in school to help us facilitate this.

Over the coming few weeks we are continuing to develop the outdoors area in EYFS and outside Squirrel class. Many thanks to the parents who have donated items for the resourcing of this - pots, pans, dressing up real life clothes, balance bikes etc. School is investing a pot of money to help restock and resource this area, which we hope will be well-used in the coming term.

Thank you to Miss Lee, Mrs Chand and Mrs Burton for this week's pre-school, toddler and EYFS parent lunch. It was super to see our children, parents and Year 6 buddles chatting with one another. We love having our toddler group join us for lunch and seeing our school family in action.

Owl class enjoyed a wonderful visit from Abdullah and Amirah's aunty, an optician, who taught us all (including Mrs Cast and Miss Perkins) lots about the human eye, vision and light! A HUGE thank you to her for giving so generously of her time and helping bring our learning to life.

Outdoor Learning & Activities

Our Fox class residential was a triumph. We enjoyed an action-packed itinerary and spent practically all our time outside (which was a joy thanks to some rather kind Spring weather). One of the most challenging activities of the residential was making our own beds! We had to put on out own duvet cover, pillowcases and bottom sheets. Mums and dads - please make sure that the children are in charge of all beds at home now, as they have had to learn how to be independent (just with a little help from their friends and teachers!)

After tea, we were off out again for our evening activities - we had to make a creative, small den to house a hedgehog or squirrel (including some fun items - a chimney, a sofa and a comfy bed). The dens were so creative and used natural materials in really inventive ways. Then we had a campfire and toasted marshmallows.

It was then inside time - Mrs Gow's legendary hot chocolate (made this year by Mrs Gow and Mrs Burton), story time, PJ time and then bed.... and then sleep.....after a while....and a bit more giggling....and a bit more chatting..... and more giggling....

Thursday was our watersports day - this year it was rafted kayaking (two kayaks lashed together to make a raft). In our teams of 7/8 off we went onto the reservoir to learn how to paddle. Can you help with our outdoor provision?



Over the coming term we are going to be developing the zones in our infant outdoor provision and we are looking for some help. We are desperately trying to become more authentic, sustainable and use less/limited plastic in our indoor and outdoor provision. That means that we are looking to stock up on lots of reusable, natural and real-life resources for our children. We are looking to gather and buy in reusable and authentic resources that are open-ended and the children can use in lots of the different areas of learning. We are particularly looking for:

- tin/stainless steel bowls, teapots, cups, pans etc for our mud kitchen areas big pans, mixing bowls, jars
- wooden/metal spoons, utensils, spatulas, pestle and mortars etc
- real life dress up clothes eg, handbags, hats, walking sticks etc
- pebbles, rocks, shells
- old (no longer working or defunct) toaster, kettle, microwaves, clocks, telephones, typewriters
- milk crates, cable drums, pallets (safe ones), wooden planters
- guttering offcuts, drainpipes, tubes, trellis
- soil, herbs and scented plant cutting eg lavenders, herbs
- clean offcuts of wood, drain pipes, cones
- tree stumps, offcuts, branches, logs, small tyres
- outdoor rugs, cushions etc
- decking pieces

Guitar lessons in school



This morning we met Barney from Lancashire Music service. He is going to be our new acoustic guitar teacher. We heard him play at the start of worship and he also went around each class to give the

children a chance to explore the guitar and have a go at strumming. Please do consider signing your child up for instrumental lessons - they make a massive difference to your child's concentration, self-esteem and also have an impact on their overall learning capabilities.

We have the opportunity through Lancashire Music Service of running acoustic guitar lessons for Years 2 to 6 with one of their instrumental teachers. We know many of you have been interested in guitar lessons for your children and we're pleased that we can offer this within school.

The guitar lessons will take place on Tuesday mornings and the children will come out of class lessons for these. We will try and move the music lessons around so the children are not missing the same class lesson each week.

You can choose for the children to be taught in small groups or individually and the price will vary depending on your choice. The children will need to provide their own guitar or you can rent one from Lancashire Music service. Payment for these lessons will be direct to the Music Service.
